Thought for the Month

Our first Sunday in May brings around our annual Rogation service, this time at Dancer's Farm at 10.30am in North Marston. I must confess that I am one of those who has always been a little bit confused about Rogation. The word itself doesn't seem to mean anything, although it sounds like it should. It's the sort of thing that would get wheeled out on "Would I lie to you?". Ah yes, rogation – the feeling you get when you go down a helterskelter. It's Latin root means "to ask", but over the millennia, it has come to mean a service held in a barn. Sitting on hay bales. With cows next door adding to the soundtrack. And it really is a lovely scene.

Rogation is best understood in the context of Harvest. Harvest is easy to understand. Every autumn, we give thanks to God for the food that's been produced, for the produce of the land and for the work of our farmers. Rogation is simply the start of that process. Rogation is where we ask God for his blessings on the sowing of seed and the rearing of livestock, that the coming months will go well and that the harvest will be good.

But there is also a broader aspect to Rogation. It is where we ask God to bless what we do, whether that is farming or otherwise. And as such, Rogation is not simply a rural celebration, it is relevant to everyone, whatever we do. Peter Evans
